Establishment of Quorum:

The Chair, Commissioner MacWood, called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm and announced that there was a quorum.

Verification of Notice:

The Chair confirmed that notice of the meeting had been sent to eight local community listservs and apartment listserv moderators and posted on the ANC3C website and Twitter.

Approval of Agenda:

Commissioner Bradbery moved approval of the amended agenda. The agenda was adopted by voice vote.

Announcements:

Commissioner MacWood gave Councilmember White's announcements that were sent from Kitri Suri Legislative Counsel. WMATA is currently accepting public input on their Fiscal Year 2020-2021 budget proposals. The Navy Community Planner, Captain Dix, said that the US&O Naval Observatory has a construction plan starting soon and will be going on for the next 4 years. There will be minimal impact to the community. 30-50 workers at a time and all parking will be onsite so there should not be a disruption.

Consent Calendar:

Commissioner Hersh made a motion to approve the consent calendar which included the Historic Preservation Review Board Application (HPA 20-135) regarding 2829 29th Street NW for rooftop rear addition, a resolution regarding the 2020 United Airlines Rock 'n' Roll DC Marathon and Half Marathon Series, a resolution regarding Funding Support for FY21 "Birth to Three for All DC Amendment Act of 2018," the Historic Preservation Review Board Application (HPA 20-178) regarding 3411 Ordway Street NW for a 2-story garage accessory structure and a sub-grade rear addition, a resolution on the need for the Mayor and Council to fund the Campaign Finance Reform Amendment Act of 2018, otherwise known as the Pay-to-Play Law, in the upcoming Budget, and a resolution regarding WMATA's proposed bus cuts and service changes for FY2021. The motion was approved by voice vote.

Commission Business:

1. Presentation by Zach Rybarczyk regarding Cleveland Park Main Street

2. Consideration of a Historic Preservation Review Board Application (HPA 20-095) regarding 3100 Macomb Street NW for concept/new construction of the Washington International School science/academic building

The Head of the School presented information.

Commissioner MacWood read and moved the resolution. The Applicant is willing to accommodate comments from the HPRB and work with them to achieve a balance of the objects. Bonnie LePard, Land Use Attorney and used to be President of Friends for Tregaron, is not excited about the plans. Susan, Chair of Conservancy of Tregaron, will keep working to make sure pedestrians will have access during construction and they are in support of the plans. Some students voiced their support. Some neighbors voiced their concerns. The motion was approved by voice vote.

 7. Commissioner Hersh said that the Rat Summit part 2 was held in February for 3500 Connecticut Ave NW. They met with property

managers, residents, and DPH. The businesses are looking to get a trash compacter. The breeding season has started sooner because of the milder winter.

She also wants to thank Rich Harrington and the Mayor's Office because they have been working on identification of language that is very heteronormative in DC government and how language like birth certificates have been amended.

The owner of Macklin will be back before us in March and BZA in April. She also has a bittersweet announcement that she will be leaving the Commission. Tonight, will be her last meeting. She will be submitting the information to the Board of Elections after this month's meeting. She wants to thank commissioners and the community.
