Establishment of Quorum:

Chair Finley called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. and announced there was a quorum. Commissioners Boucher, Fink, Hoyt, and Reba were absent.

Verification of Notice:

Chair Finley confirmed notice of the meeting was sent to the eight local community listservs, apartment listserv moderators, and posted on the ANC3C website and Twitter.

Approval of Agenda:

Commissioner Siddiqui moved approval of the amended agenda. The agenda was adopted by voice vote.

Commission Business:

1. *Consideration of 2022 ANC3C Meeting Dates*

Commissioner Finley moved approval of the 2022 ANC3C Meeting Dates as January 19th, February 22nd, March 21st, April 18th, May 16th, June 22nd, July 18th, September 19th, October 17th, November 14th, December 13th. The motion was approved by voice vote.

2. *Consideration of a resolution regarding Transportation Safety Improvements on Porter Street* Commissioner Finley read and moved the resolution. The motion was approved by voice vote.

3. *Consideration of a motion to approve nominations of Warren Gorlick, Naihua Duan, Tammy Gordon, and Michael Rifer to the ANC3C Transportation Committee*

Commissioner Siddiqui moved approval of the nominations. The motion was approved by voice vote.

Other Business:

1. Secretary's Report: Commissioner Siddiqui moved approval of the November 15, 2021 minutes. The motion was approved by voice vote.
2. Treasurer's Report: Commissioner Siddiqui said the only monthly expenditure was paying the administrator \$540.84.
3. SMD Reports:
 - **(3C01) Commissioner Reba (read by Commissioner MacWood):** A) Kennedy Warren - There are still complaints regarding poor performance of the traffic signal at the Kennedy-Warren garage exit on Connecticut Avenue, adjacent to the National Zoo entrance/exit. While I plan to meet with residents, I have reached out to Tony Donaldson (*Ward 3 MOCA*) multiple times - with no response to date. I have since reached out to, Jackie Reyes-Yanes, the new Director of the Mayor's Office of Community Affairs (MOCA) - and will also reach out to Christian Piñeiro, DDOT's Community Engagement Specialist for Ward 3. B) WP Commercial District - 1) Han Palace (*former Starbucks location*) will not open this month as planned due to supply chain issues which is also delaying their DCRA occupancy certificate. The grand opening will be based on when the certificate of occupancy is received. An anticipated opening is slated for mid-January. 2) The building owner of the former Dunkin Donut space is still working a good use for the space. C) National Zoo - As a reminder, the Smithsonian made the difficult decision to cancel several events that traditionally take place in the Fall and sadly, the next cancelled event on the calendar is ZooLights.
 - **(3C02) Commissioner Fink:** Absent
 - **(3C03) Commissioner Pagats:** Multiple issues on Cortland and she is working on those with Commissioner Gersten.
 - **(3C04) Commissioner Finley:** Residents on Quebec Street are fond of having a speed table on Quebec Street.
 - **(3C05) Commissioner Siddiqui:** A) Regarding Hearst Park & Pool, DGS posted a response to my letter. B) There is another new issue, the number of lights on at night are making the area too bright and the neighbors want these lights turned off.
 - **(3C06) Commissioner Hoyt:** Absent
 - **(3C07) Commissioner Boucher:** Absent
 - **(3C08) Commissioner Gersten:** Street(s) repaving project completed, however, the 'raised crosswalks' were not reinstalled - but am working on getting them back.
 - **(3C09) Commissioner MacWood:** A) Pepco has been replacing utility poles, however, the old poles still remain, but am working and pushing to get the older ones removed as soon as possible. B) There was a mystery on Macomb Street (*between 34th and Connecticut Avenue*). DDOT is the culprit of surveyors in the neighborhood and have determined that this section of the roadway should be further engineered. DDOT commissioned surveyors to determine where public parking of the lot ends.

Commissioner Siddiqui moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was approved by voice vote and the meeting adjourned at 8:13 p.m.
